

Kemampuan perawat pada praktik deteksi dini kanker payudara: A systematic review = Nurses' ability in early detection of breast cancer practices: A systematic review.

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Abstrak

Skrining kanker payudara merupakan salah satu strategi pencegahan yang dilakukan perawat sebagai peran dan tanggung jawab professional untuk menurunkan angka mortalitas dan morbiditas kanker payudara, namun saat ini penerapan praktiknya belum berjalan dengan optimal. Tujuan dari telaah sistematik ini adalah untuk mengidentifikasi, menilai, dan mensintesis gambaran penerapan kemampuan perawat dalam praktik deteksi dini kanker payudara. Pencarian data penelitian dilakukan dengan strategi PRISMA melalui lima basis data: Google Scholar, PubMed Central, Science Direct, ProQuest, dan Oxford Journals pada bulan Mei-Juli 2020 dan dihasilkan 10 artikel untuk dianalisis. Pengetahuan dan sikap memengaruhi praktik perawat dalam deteksi dini kanker payudara. Pemahaman yang belum cukup baik memengaruhi praktik skrining kanker payudara yang rendah, walaupun sikap sudah positif. Penelitian menunjukkan pentingnya meningkatkan kemampuan perawat dalam praktik skrining kanker payudara melalui pendidikan berkelanjutan dan pelatihan yang adekuat serta dukungan dari penyusun kebijakan.

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Breast cancer screening is a preventive strategy carried out by nurses as a professional role and responsibility to reduce mortality and morbidity due to breast cancer, but currently the practice has not been optimal. The purpose of this systematic study was to identify, assess, and synthesize an overview of the application of nurses' abilities in the practice of early detection of breast cancer. Research data search was carried out using the PRISMA strategy through five databases: Google Scholar, PubMed Central, Science Direct, ProQuest, and Oxford Journals during May-July 2020 and produced 10 articles to be analyzed. Knowledge and attitudes influence nurses' practices in early detection of breast cancer. Inadequate understanding caused inadequate breast cancer screening practices, even though their attitudes were already positive. This study showed the importance of promoting nurses' abilities of breast cancer screening practices through continuing education and adequate training as well as supports from policy makers.
